#### 1. What motivates you to apply for this position?

## 2. Where do you fall on the conservative-liberal spectrum in terms of fiscal and social policy?

As a libertarian, I am socially liberal and fiscally conservative; meaning, making sure that we can meet our financial contractual obligations with the taxpayer, ensuring good stewardship of his public trust.

### 3. In your eyes, what should be the top 2 or 3 priorities our City Council should be focused on in the upcoming year and why?

Infrastructure should be a top focus. A healthy city is a prosperous one. In order to attract jobs, businesses need sound infrastructure. Also, a high priority is maintaining quality essential service personnel -- police, fire and rescue -- by offering competitive wages.

## 4. What do you consider the most crucial problem, need, or cause for the citizens of Asheville? How would you approach its resolution or champion the cause?

Thriftiness with the public trust is our top priority. The risk of over-taxation and its effect on small businesses is crucial to our current job situation. From transparency in government and policing to sound budgetary planning. As well as wise land usage decisions. I champion the cause of being an objective voice for nonpartisan cooperation.

# 5. 2008-09 and 2009-10 fiscal years will be financially tough for the City. What will be your top funding priorities and what would you like to see reduced to balance the budget?

Again, top priority should be given to infrastructure, water, power, and transportation as that is the top responsibility of this body. High priority should also be given to experienced employee retention.

A budgetary cut that I favor would be to privatized the golf course for a \$1.1M annual savings. I would also look for ways to reduce spending across the board in all departments.
